The scheme aims to introduce light controlled pedestrian crossing facilities, kerb realignments and additional carriageway markings to assist pedestrians (especially those with disability and schoolchildren) to cross the road as well as allowing cyclists to wait in the advanced cycle lane box ahead of motor vehicles.
